#### LENT

Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday to the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive (29<sup>th</sup> March). On Good Friday and, if possible, also on Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil, the Easter fast is observed.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS FOR LENTEN PENANCE**

- 1. Abstinence from meat, and fasting, are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. All who have completed their 18th year and have not yet begun their 60th year are bound to fast. All who have completed their 14th year are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. On all other Fridays of the year including the Fridays of Lent, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following.
- (a) prayer for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a Church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary.
- (b) (b) self denial for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or overburdened.

During Lent **penance** should be not only inward and individual, but also outward and social SC110

#### PASCHAL PRECEPT

Each of the faithful is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. This is to be done between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday unless for a good reason, it is done at another time during the year. All the faithful are obliged to confess their grave sins at least once a year.
